Dr. Yallampalli is "The Face of Hope" for March, 2022.

He is the Radiology Director at Memorial Hermann Southeast and Memorial Hermann Pearland hospitals in Houston, Tx. He has been an Interventional Radiologist for eight years, as well as working with Synergy Radiology, an Affiliate of Radiology Partners who offer a full-service practice, with state-of-the-art imaging.

Through this collaboration of multidisciplinary teams, multiple expert opinions can be offered to individualize each treatment plan. Using this approach keeps each patient and their treatment plan continuously in the forethought of physicians, allowing each team member the ability to provide the most optimal, comprehensive, and personalized treatment plan for their patient.

Interventional Radiology continues to be a rapidly evolving field on the cutting edge of medicine. Treatments, that in the past would have required extensive surgeries can easily be done now through Interventional Radiology. Patients return home after the out-patient procedure, with a mere band-aid covering the small incision. Dr. Yallampalli takes a special interest in Interventional Radiology because of its ability to provide these minimally invasive procedures. Triple Negative Breast Cancer Day

Triple Negative Breast Cancer Day was March 3rd, 2022, & is the only global event dedicated to both awareness exclusively for triple negative breast caner. Each year, approxiately 10-20% of breast cancer dignoses are designated as the agressive subtyppe "Triple Negative." The diagnosis of Triple Negative Breast Cancer means that the tumor is Estrogen Receptor negative, Progesterone Receptor negative & HER2 negative, thus giving side to the name "Triple Negative Breast Cancer."

This type of breast cancer is typically responsive to chemotherapy. Because of its triple negative status, however, triple negative tumors do not generally respond to receptor targeted treatments.

Marsha Lindley is a mTNBC patient who recently finished her radiation treatments for lung mets. She states, "I am thankful for the increased attention to this type of breast cancer and I am benefiting from the recent research!"





the importance of a special, personalized care plan for each patient he treats, helping provide the best possible outcome. He monitors the complexity of the disease process, along with personal struggles patients may endure with their cancer journey, minimizing issues that could hinder their outcome.

Y-90 Radioemobilization is the most cutting edge, minimally invasive option for treating inoperable liver tumors, which helps to greatly improve the quality of life for cancer patients. This out-patient treatment involves the injection of tiny microspheres containing radioactive material into the specific arteries that supply blood flow to each tumor, effectively killing the tumor from within. Dr. Yallampalli has recently completed his 100th Y-90 procedure. As the "Face of Hope," Dr. Yallampalli is, "Hopeful that one day cancer will be a memory of the past," making him especially excited to be part of this rapidly growing field of tumor therapy. Having grown up in the Clear Lake area also adds special meaning to Dr. Yallampalli, as he is allowed to "Give Back," to the community from which he came.
